Romans 15:8-16:27-How To Live Honoring the Gospel

- I. <u>Implication For Christian Life in Relationships with Christians of Different Backgrounds Christ Hope of Jews</u> and Gentiles (Rom. 15:8-13)
 - A. Confirms God's Truthfulness/Faithfulness in Promises to the Patriarchs
 - B. Gentiles Glorify God for His Mercy
 - C. Importance of Knowledge of Old Testament Scripture
 - 1. Was it written in former days for us? (v. 15)
 - D. God of Hope
 - 1. What is our hope?
 - 2. How can we have joy?
 - 3. How can we have peace?
- II. Implication for Support of Paul's Ministry-Gospel to Gentiles (Rom. 15:14-33)
 - A. Reminds Them That Spreading the Gospel is Priestly Service.
 - 1. What reason does Paul have to be proud?
 - 2. How is Paul's work with the gentiles an offering to God an acceptable sacrifice? What kind of offering?
 - B. Paul's Ministry Brings Gentiles to Obedience to Gospel (Rom 1:5, 16:26)

How is this achieved?

- 1. By word and deed
- 2. By signs and wonders
- 3. By power through this Holy Spirit of God
- C. Goal-To Fulfill His Ministry from Jerusalem to Illyricum
 - 1. Emphasis on preaching in new areas
 - 2. Highlights Paul's responsibility to go and preach
- D. Practical Implications in the Gospel- exhorted to prayerfully, financially, and physically support Gospel workers
 - 1. Constrains our behavior (15:22-24)
 - 2. Encourages generous support- workers /those spreading the truth (15:25-30)
 - Paul requests to be helped along the journey to Spain
 - Principle-If one benefits spiritually from the gospel then one should serve materially regarding gospel work. *What are some examples?*
 - 3. Requires earnest prayer (15: 30-33) How is prayer requested/answered?
 - Delivered from unbelievers in Jerusalem
 - Paul's service for Jerusalem will be acceptable to the saints
 - Paul may come to Rome with joy and be refreshed by the Roman Christians

III. Paul's Concluding Mandates

- A. Appreciate Christian Workers (16:1-16)
 - 1. Twenty-five Names, One Mother, One Sister, Several Brothers, Two Families
 - 2. Letter of Commendation for Phoebe

- Servant (deaconess)
- Helper (patron of many)
- What can we learn from this letter about our current use of letters of commendation in God's assembly?
- 3. Greet means pay one's respect /salute
- 4. Aspects to appreciate about others and imitate
 - Hard Workers
 - Devoted Workers-Priscilla/Aquila risked their necks
 - Workers who loved the Word of God
 - New converts/Old Soldiers
 - Free/Slaves-all chosen (choice)
 - Everyday Living/Difficult Trials
- B. Avoid Contentious People (16:17-20)
 - 1. Avoid those that cause division(discord)/create obstacles (hinder/antagonize)
 - 2. Seek sound doctrine that you have been taught
 - 3. Be wise in good and innocent of evil
 - 4. Source of disunity-Satan- He will be crushed!
- C. Be Encouraged By Christian Leaders
 - 1. Strong leaders thinking about Roman Christians encouraged Roman Christians
 - 2. For those who are leaders, do you acknowledge other Christians?
- D. Glorify God-the goal for unity amongst Christians is to glorify God
 - 1. Gospel has continuity with old testament
 - 2. This Gospel strengthens believers and produces active faith among all believers from all nations.
 - 3. God brings glory to himself through the Gospel of Christ
 - 4. What is a mystery?
 - 5. What are the prophetic writings here?
 - 6. The Gospel is the power of God. It should energize us to spread the Gospel and create in us a passion for souls and a desire to glorify God.
